Dear Members, Trainees & Friends,

Last week was incredible. Special thanks to Adiaha Spinks-Franklin, MD, MPH, FAAP for leading an important and inspiring discussion of R.A.C.E.C.A.R.D. and it's relation to SDBP. The Board spent a lot of time last week discussing Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, as well as anti-racism in particular, starting with a subgroup of the Board discussing priorities for addressing anti-racism in SDBP as well as how we can be anti-racist providers, working with our trainees, families and children in our day to day practice, research and education. Dr. Spinks-Franklin's discussion was next, with a lot of insight and challenge to each of us to examine our own biases and actions. As you know, SDBP Committees exist to implement the SDBP Strategic Plan or essential operational functions of the Society. By adding this committee, we are taking a step to ensure that Diversity, Equity and Inclusion are seen as a key priority for our society.

Many other creative ideas have come out of our discussions, including that the Board has approved partnering with the Academic Pediatric Association's New Century Scholars program to recruit a DBPeds focused resident. As we finalize the outline for this, we will be looking for both a senior and junior DBPeds mentor! Another idea that is already scheduled is that Board and RACECARD member, Dr. Tanya Froehlich, will lead a journal club during our August 22nd SDBP connect call. She will share a few key anti-racism articles in advance (yes, look for them soon!) and I look forward to a rich discussion that day! In addition to more formal anti racism training for SDBP leadership, we are also looking at ways to provide ongoing educational opportunities for our membership.

Finally, I have been blown away this week by the work done by the Program Committee! They are working tirelessly to set up a rich, robust and do-able virtual meeting (yes, Zoom fatigue is being strongly considered!) that will keep us all connected. A tentative schedule will be coming soon!
