December 16 was match day for DBP. Congratulations to many of the DBP programs! There were 32 applicants (up from a significant dip last year of 24) and a total of 42 positions in 32 programs. (2 programs withdrew). In total, 24 programs filled. So, the fill rate is improved over past years, but the number of positions offered and the number of active programs is lower than what it has been for the past 4-5 years. So overall, an improvement from last year, and maybe gentle growth since 2011. We still need to focus on workforce development!
